STATIONERY & BOOKLISTS

Families are requested to purchase the designated stationery items & books from the College booklist for each school year. This information is distributed to families in Term 4 each year and will become available on the College Website. We have utilised the booklist as much as possible to keep the financial contributions to a minimum for parents/guardians.

UNIFORM

All students are required to have a full school uniform and it must be worn at all times, to and from school. Please see the College's Uniform Policy for guidelines and procedures around uniform. The College uniform list is provided to families in the enrolment pack and is available from the front office and on the College Website.

LAPTOPS

All students are requested to purchase a laptop as prescribed or provide one of their own. These laptops will work within the College IT Networks and provide the student with the resources to complete classroom work and assessment tasks. For laptops purchased outside of the College program it is the responsibility of the family to ensure it meets the minimum specifications required.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY - ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions	Other Contributions	Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g., textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child does not miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
