# **2024 Parent Payment Arrangements**

Dear parent/guardian,

Greenvale Secondary College is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you in advance for all your support, whatever it may be, during your time at Greenvale Secondary College. It will make a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

#### STATIONERY & BOOKLISTS

Families are requested to purchase the designated stationery items and books from the College booklist for each school year. This information is distributed to families in Term 4 each year and will become available on the College Website. We have utilised the booklist as much as possible to keep the financial contributions to a minimum for parents/guardians.

#### **UNIFORM**

All students are required to have a full school uniform and it must be worn at all times, to and from school. Please see the College's Uniform Policy for guidelines and procedures around uniform. The College uniform list is provided to families in the enrolment pack and is available from the front office and on the College Website.

#### **LAPTOPS**

All students are requested to purchase a laptop as prescribed or provide one of their own. These laptops will work within the College IT Networks and provide the student with the resources to complete classroom work and assessment tasks. For laptops purchased outside of the College program it is the responsibility of the family to ensure it meets the minimum specifications required.

#### **PAYMENT METHODS**

Contributions towards the requested payments are essential to maintain the quality of education that we will provide at Greenvale Secondary College. Payments can be made in any of the following ways:

- On Compass through CompassPay
- Cash
- EFTPOS
- Electronic bank transfer (Direct Deposit)
- BPAY

You can also set up a **reoccurring payment plan** (for an amount and frequency of your choice) in Compass. This is useful for families who want to manage cash flow and make regular payments over the course of the school year.
